## PROGRAM AND CONTENT



Boardway Bound provides interactive content and conversations with leaders from the Cincinnati region's arts community. Each session explores real-life issues confronting arts boards and provides time for networking with fellow participants and the local arts community, sponsored by Thompson Hine.

The 2024 content includes six in-person sessions at ArtsWave, culminating in our signature Speed Dating. Participatory sessions will be facilitated by professionals both in arts organizations and experienced board members, supplemented by relevant articles, videos and sample board materials with the final gathering being a graduation celebration. Additionally, participants will be invited to our special BLINK opening night social on October 17.

A defining feature of Boardway Bound is our "speed dating" interview process. In the final session, candidates come face-to-face with arts clients for mutual interviews. ArtsWave then matches the top choices of participants with the top choices of arts clients to begin a relationship that they define together.

- November 14: My Board Service: Getting Started
- November 21: Fundraising and Putting It All Together
- December 5: Speed Dating
- December 12: Graduation

Sessions are 3:30-6:30 p.m. with Nightly Networking, drinks and light snacks from 3:30-4 p.m. Participants are expected to attend all sessions.

Participants may have limited board experience but seek professional development in governance and best practices. Some participants have served on boards in other fields and desire more in-depth knowledge of the issues unique to nonprofit arts. Others are new to the region and are looking to make lasting connections.

**ArtsWave encourages candidates from diverse backgrounds to apply. Together, we can ensure that the programs and practices of the region's arts and cultural organizations are reflective of our entire community.**
