- Perspectives on local arts and cultural organizations and the unique issues confronting them

PROGRAM AND CONTENT



Boardway Bound provides discussions and conversations with leaders from the Cincinnati region's arts community. Each session explores real-life issues confronting arts boards and provides time for networking with fellow participants and the local arts community, sponsored by Thompson Hine.

The 2023 content includes six in-person sessions at ArtsWave, culminating in our signature Speed Dating. Participatory sessions will be facilitated by professionals both in arts organizations and experienced board members, supplemented by relevant articles, videos and sample board materials.

A defining feature of Boardway Bound is our "speed dating" interview process. In the final class, candidates come face-to-face with arts clients for mutual interviews. ArtsWave then matches the top choices of participants with the top choices of arts clients to begin a relationship that they define together.

- November 2: Understanding Nonprofit Finance and Marketing

- November 30: Speed Dating
- December 7: Graduation

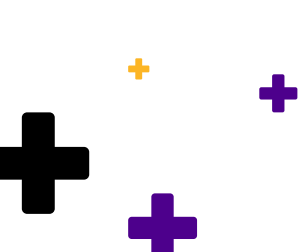
