# ArtsWave Completes Three-Year Funding Cycle with Continued Support for Local Arts Organizations

**CINCINNATI (June 25, 2025)** — This past Friday, the Board of Trustees for ArtsWave approved \$8,792,540 in grant expenditures from its recent 2025 Community Campaign. The investment will extend operating support for 45 local arts organizations through Sustaining Impact grants for FY2026.

Sustaining Impact grants represent ArtsWave's largest and most enduring investment in the region's arts. These core grants help ensure financial stability and long-term impact for Cincinnati's arts and cultural institutions, organizations that are essential to the vibrancy and strength of the region.

This year's grant decisions mark the completion of a three-year funding cycle guided by ArtsWave's Blueprint for Collective Action for the Arts Sector, a strategic framework to build a more inclusive, vibrant, and connected community through the arts.

In total, 45 arts organizations will receive renewed operating support, with funding levels sustained thanks to community donations to the 2025 ArtsWave Campaign. Additional project grants from the Campaign will be announced in the months ahead.

ArtsWave's Board considered each organization's community impact, governance, and financial health, using a model grounded in campaign performance and reviewed by volunteer panels made up of more than 35 civic, business and community leaders. The panels represent a diverse cross-section of Greater Cincinnati and reflect ArtsWave's commitment to broad community input and transparency.

Mel Gravely, 2025 ArtsWave Campaign Chair, noted, "These investments in the arts are vital to bridging cultural divides in our community. The arts create spaces where people from all backgrounds can come together, share experiences, and build understanding across differences."

Alecia Kintner, ArtsWave President & CEO, emphasized the continued return on the region's collective investment: "For every \$1 invested through the ArtsWave Community Campaign, our arts partners generate nearly \$43 in economic value for Greater Cincinnati. The arts are not an 'extra'—they are an essential."

The Sustaining Impact grants are a cornerstone of ArtsWave's annual support for the region's arts ecosystem. As the organization looks ahead to its centennial in 2027, it continues to deepen its commitment to a thriving, inclusive arts sector, one that helps fuel a vibrant economy and a connected community across the Cincinnati region.
